This guide serves as a Kingdom discipleship companion that helps believers move from: hearing → examining → repenting → aligning → obeying → living. The goal is not merely information, but transformation through obedience under the rule of the King.

CLASS 1

Seek First The Kingdom

Understanding Yeshua's Command & Kingdom Priority

SECTION 1 - INTRODUCTION

Matthew 6:33

“But seek ye first the kingdom of Elohim, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.”

Teaching 1 reminded us that the foundation of true discipleship begins with seeking first the Kingdom of Elohim above all else. Yeshua did not call believers to simply acknowledge Him with words, but to fully surrender to the government, authority, and will of the Father.

Throughout this teaching, we were reminded that the Kingdom is not built upon religious performance, tradition, or surface-level belief, but upon repentance, obedience, alignment, and transformation. As disciples of Yeshua Messiah, we are called to live as citizens of the Kingdom - reflecting His character, walking in holiness, and submitting every area of our lives to His authority.

We also examined the importance of spiritual alignment and the danger of pursuing personal desires, worldly priorities, or self-centered ambition above the will of Elohim. Seeking first the Kingdom requires surrendering our own understanding in order to walk according to the ways, purposes, and commands of the Father.

Teaching 1 served as a call to refocus our hearts, renew our minds, and realign our lives with the priorities of the Kingdom. It challenged us to move beyond passive belief into active discipleship - where obedience becomes evidence of our love for Elohim and our lives become a reflection of His glory in the earth.

As we continue through this framework, may we remain mindful that the Kingdom of Elohim must first be established within us before it can truly be demonstrated through us.

Kingdom Principle

The Kingdom must first be established within the heart before it can be demonstrated through the life.

SECTION 2 - WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO SEEK?

Deuteronomy 4:29

Biblical seeking is active pursuit that leads to surrender and obedience. The Hebrew concept darash means to search out, pursue intentionally, and inquire deeply with commitment.

**Elohim is not hiding from the believer who seeks Him sincerely.
Wholehearted pursuit always leads closer to His presence, His
wisdom, and His restoring power.**

Key Kingdom Truths

- Seeking is not casual interest.
- Seeking requires wholehearted pursuit.
- Seeking produces repentance and alignment.
- Seeking involves action, not information alone.

Kingdom Principle

Wholehearted pursuit of Elohim always leads to surrender, alignment, and obedient transformation.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO “SEEK”?

When Yeshua says, “seek,” He is not speaking of a casual or emotional pursuit. The concept behind this word aligns with the Hebrew verb *darash*, which means:

- to search out
- to inquire deeply
- to pursue intentionally
- to investigate with commitment

This kind of seeking is deliberate, continual, and active.

SECTION 3 - WHAT DOES “FIRST” MEAN?

Exodus 20:3

Elohim must not merely exist within life - He must govern life. The word first reflects the Hebrew understanding of rishon: chief, foremost, governing, supreme.

**When Elohim is restored to first place, peace begins to return.
Kingdom order restores stability where fear, striving, and
confusion once ruled.**

Key Kingdom Truths

- What is first determines direction.
- Disorder follows divided allegiance.
- Peace returns when Elohim is restored to first place.
- Kingdom alignment requires surrender.

Kingdom Principle

When Elohim is restored to first place, Kingdom order brings peace, stability, and direction.

SECTION 4 - WHAT IS THE KINGDOM OF ELOHIM?

Luke 17:20-21

The Kingdom is the active reign of Elohim expressed through obedient lives. The Kingdom begins internally through submission and manifests outwardly through obedience.

The Kingdom of Elohim is not distant from the believer who submits to the King. Every act of obedience becomes evidence that Heaven's government is working within you.

Key Kingdom Truths

- The Kingdom is governance, not merely territory.
- Kingdom citizens live under the rule of the King.
- The Kingdom is revealed through obedience.
- Transformation reflects Kingdom rule.

Kingdom Principle

The Kingdom is demonstrated through transformed lives submitted to the rule and authority of the King.

Malkuth does not primarily describe territory - it describes governance.

SECTION 5 - WHAT IS HIS RIGHTEOUSNESS?

Deuteronomy 6:25

Righteousness reflects covenant faithfulness, right order, justice, and obedience. It is visible obedience flowing from submission to the King.

Elohim does not call His people to righteousness without also giving grace to walk in it. As believers submit to the King, His Spirit strengthens them to live differently.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Righteousness affects conduct, thoughts, and decisions.
- Where the King reigns, righteousness becomes visible.
- Kingdom authority produces Kingdom character.
- Obedience reveals allegiance.

Kingdom Principle

True righteousness is revealed through a life aligned with Elohim's ways, character, and commands.

SECTION 6 - “ALL THESE THINGS SHALL BE ADDED”

Deuteronomy 11:13-15

Yeshua teaches that provision follows alignment. Kingdom citizens are not instructed to chase provision, but to trust the King while remaining under His rule.

The believer who seeks the Kingdom first does not walk alone. The King faithfully sustains, establishes, guides, and provides for those who remain aligned under His rule.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Provision follows obedience.
- The King assumes responsibility for aligned citizens.
- Kingdom life is built upon trust, not anxiety.
- Divine order releases divine supply.

Kingdom Principle

Provision follows alignment as the King faithfully sustains those who remain under His rule.

KINGDOM ACTION STEPS

- Begin each day with surrender and prayer.
- Search the Scriptures daily.
- Respond immediately to conviction.
- Remove distractions competing with Kingdom priority.
- Practice quick and full obedience.
- Journal areas where Elohim is restoring order.
- Invite the Holy Spirit to expose misalignment.

PRAYER OF TRANSFORMATION

Father, establish Your Kingdom within me.

Expose every area still governed by self, fear, pride, or compromise.

Teach me to seek You first with wholehearted surrender.

Restore alignment where there has been disorder,
obedience where there has been delay,
and transformation where there has only been information.

Let my life become visible evidence of Your reign,

Your righteousness,

and Your authority.
