Covenant & Kingdom Identity

Belonging & Becoming Kingdom Citizens

SECTION 1 - INTRODUCTION

1 Peter 2:9

“Ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people.”

Week Three of the Kingdom Discipleship Framework answers the question every disciple must settle: Who am I within the Kingdom?

Week One established that the Kingdom must come first. Week Two established that the Kingdom functions as the divine government of the eternal King. Week Three now reveals that Kingdom life is not only about what we believe or what we do. It is also about who we become under the rule of the King.

Many seek purpose before identity, assignment before covenant, authority before submission, and influence before faithfulness. Yet throughout Scripture, Elohim begins with identity. Before assignment comes covenant. Before responsibility comes relationship. Before representation comes belonging.

Kingdom identity unfolds through a divine pattern: identity, transformation, allegiance, and endurance.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Identity establishes who we belong to.
- Transformation conforms us to the character of the King.
- Allegiance demonstrates where our loyalty rests.
- Endurance proves that citizenship is genuine.

Kingdom Principle

Kingdom identity is received through covenant relationship with the King and revealed through a transformed, faithful life.

SECTION 2 - COVENANT & KINGDOM IDENTITY

Genesis 17:7

"I will establish my covenant between me and thee and thy seed after thee."

Before we can understand Kingdom identity, we must first understand covenant because identity is the fruit of belonging. A person cannot fully understand who they are until they understand whose they are.

The world searches for identity through culture, accomplishments, relationships, status, careers, personal desires, and self-definition. Scripture reveals that identity is not discovered by looking inward. Identity is established by the One who created us and called us unto Himself.

A covenant is more than an agreement. It establishes relationship, loyalty, inheritance, citizenship, and identity. Covenant establishes belonging, and belonging establishes identity.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Covenant establishes belonging.
- Belonging establishes identity.
- Before assignment comes covenant.
- Kingdom identity begins with belonging to the King.

Kingdom Principle

Kingdom identity is not discovered through self-definition; it is received through covenant relationship with the King.

COVENANT & KINGDOM IDENTITY

Elohim has always desired a covenant people - not merely people who know about Him, but a people who belong to Him, live under His rule, walk in His ways, and reflect His character in the earth.

Before Abraham became the father of many nations, he belonged to Elohim. Before Israel became a kingdom of priests, they belonged to Elohim. Before the disciples were sent into the nations, they belonged to Yeshua.

Belonging always precedes assignment. Relationship always precedes responsibility. Covenant always precedes Kingdom representation.

SECTION 3 - KINGDOM IDENTITY IS NOT SELF-DETERMINED

Genesis 1:26-27

“So God created man in his own image.”

Kingdom identity is not self-determined. It is Creator-defined, King-established, and covenant-received. The conflict began in the garden when humanity attempted to determine truth, authority, good, evil, and identity apart from Elohim.

Every generation must answer the same question: Will identity be determined by the Word of Elohim or by the desires of humanity? This is not merely a cultural issue. It is a Kingdom issue because self-rule and Kingdom citizenship cannot coexist.

A Kingdom citizen receives identity from the King. The One who made us is the One who defines us.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Identity is received, not invented.
- The Creator has authority to define His creation.
- Self-rule and Kingdom citizenship cannot coexist.
- Repentance turns us from self-rule to the rule of Elohim.

Kingdom Principle

Only when identity is received from the King does it become rooted, secure, and unshakable.

KINGDOM IDENTITY IS NOT SELF-DETERMINED

The Torah reveals that identity is received from the Creator. The Psalms declare that we belong to Him. The Prophets remind us that the Potter has authority over the clay. Yeshua teaches that self-rule must yield to the rule of the King.

The flesh says, "I will define who I am." The Kingdom says, "The King has already spoken." The battle for identity is a battle over lordship.

Our identity is not rooted in culture, politics, social acceptance, personal ambition, success, failure, feelings, or emotions. Our identity is rooted in the King.

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

Where have I allowed the world to define me?

What identity must I surrender to the authority of the King?

Does my life reflect self-rule or Kingdom rule?

SECTION 4 - KINGDOM TRANSFORMATION

Ezekiel 36:26

“A new heart also will I give you, and a new spirit will I put within you.”

Receiving Kingdom identity requires Kingdom transformation. The King does not simply give His people a new title. He begins the work of forming them into a new people.

No one can enter covenant with the King and remain unchanged. No one can come under the rule of the Kingdom while continuing to live according to the patterns of another kingdom.

When Elohim establishes covenant, transformation begins. The purpose of covenant is to form a people who reflect the character, nature, and ways of the King.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Covenant produces inward renewal.
- A transformed heart produces transformed fruit.
- The Kingdom changes the heart, mind, conduct, priorities, and relationships.
- The evidence is not perfection, but progression.

Kingdom Principle

Kingdom citizenship is revealed through a life being transformed under the rule of the King.

KINGDOM TRANSFORMATION

The Torah reveals that covenant produces change. The Psalms call for a renewed heart. The Prophets promise inward renewal. Yeshua declares that new life is necessary.

The Kingdom transforms the heart, the mind, the conduct, the priorities, and the relationships of its citizens. What we love changes. What we pursue changes. What we obey changes. What has been changed within begins to appear without.

The goal is not merely improved behavior. The goal is conformity to the character of the King.

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

Am I being transformed under the rule of the King?

What areas of my heart still need renewal?

What fruit is revealing the condition of my heart?

SECTION 5 - ALLEGIANCE

Deuteronomy 13:3-4

“Ye shall walk after the LORD your God, and fear him, and keep his commandments.”

If transformation reveals who we are becoming, allegiance reveals who truly rules our lives. Every citizen of the Kingdom will eventually face a test of loyalty.

Allegiance is proven when obedience becomes costly, compromise appears easier, truth is opposed by culture, and faithfulness requires sacrifice. Anyone can profess loyalty when obedience is convenient. Faithful citizenship is revealed when obedience demands something of us.

The King requires exclusive allegiance. Two masters cannot govern the same servant. Two kingdoms cannot rule the same heart.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Allegiance reveals who governs the heart.
- Obedience flows from wholehearted love.
- True citizens choose truth over popularity and holiness over compromise.
- Kingdom allegiance is revealed by how we live.

Kingdom Principle

True citizenship is revealed by unwavering allegiance to the King.

ALLEGIANCE - THE EVIDENCE OF KINGDOM CITIZENSHIP

Kingdom allegiance chooses obedience over convenience, truth over popularity, holiness over compromise, faithfulness over comfort, and the Kingdom over self.

Many embrace Yeshua as Savior but resist Him as King. Yet divided allegiance always produces compromise, and compromise weakens faithful witness.

The Torah calls for wholehearted love. The Psalms celebrate an undivided heart. The Prophets expose empty profession. Yeshua demands exclusive devotion.

SECTION 6 - THE COVENANT PEOPLE MUST ENDURE

Matthew 24:13

“He that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved.”

True covenant faithfulness endures. Anyone can make a commitment, profess belief, or begin the journey. But Scripture teaches that covenant loyalty is revealed not by how a person starts, but by how they remain.

Testing reveals allegiance. Pressure exposes the heart. Trials uncover where our trust truly resides. When obedience becomes costly, endurance reveals whether our loyalty belongs to the King or to ourselves.

The Kingdom is not built upon momentary enthusiasm. The Kingdom is built upon enduring faithfulness.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Testing reveals what is in the heart.
- Endurance is active faithfulness.
- The covenant people are called to remain faithful through every season.
- Those who belong to the King continue to walk with Him.

Kingdom Principle

Covenant identity is not proven in comfort; it is revealed through faithful endurance.

THE COVENANT PEOPLE MUST ENDURE

Israel was tested in the wilderness. Caleb endured with another spirit and followed Elohim fully. David waited on Elohim through seasons of hardship. Daniel remained faithful in exile. Yeshua taught that true disciples develop roots that endure.

Endurance continues to obey, trust, follow, stand, and hope. The disciple remains faithful, obedient, and surrendered - not for a season, but until the end.

The goal is not merely to start the race. The goal is to finish it faithfully.

Will I remain faithful when trials come?

Where has pressure exposed the condition of my heart?

What must I continue to obey, trust, and stand for?

KINGDOM ACTION STEPS

- Receive identity from the King, not the world.
- Remember that belonging comes before assignment.
- Submit every false identity to the Word of Elohim.
- Invite the King to transform your heart, mind, conduct, and priorities.
- Choose obedience when it is costly.
- Guard your allegiance from compromise.
- Remain faithful through testing, pressure, and delay.
- Prepare your heart for Week 4: The Law of the Kingdom, The Word & Obedience.

PRAYER OF TRANSFORMATION

Father, establish my identity in covenant relationship with You.

Remove every false identity, every self-defined label, and every mindset that stands against Your Word. Teach me to receive who I am from You alone.

Transform my heart, renew my mind, purify my desires, and align my life with the character of Yeshua Messiah.

Strengthen my allegiance to Your Kingdom. Keep my heart undivided, my obedience faithful, and my witness pure.

Teach me to endure under pressure, remain steadfast through testing, and walk faithfully as a citizen of Your Kingdom until the end.
