CLASS 4

The Law of the Kingdom, The Word & Obedience

Walking in Faithful Obedience Under the Rule of the King

SECTION 1 - INTRODUCTION

Matthew 7:24

"Whosoever heareth these sayings of mine, and doeth them, I will liken him unto a wise man."

Week Four of the Kingdom Discipleship Framework answers the question: How should a citizen of the Kingdom live? Week One established Kingdom priority. Week Two established Kingdom structure. Week Three established covenant identity. Week Four now reveals that Kingdom citizens are called to live under the Word and instruction of the King. Obedience has never been the means of earning the King's favor. It is the faithful response of those who already belong to Him.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Relationship precedes responsibility.
- Redemption precedes instruction.
- Covenant produces obedience.
- The Word of Elohim reveals the government of the Kingdom.

Kingdom Principle

The Word of the King teaches His citizens how to live in covenant faithfulness under His righteous reign.

HOW SHOULD A KINGDOM CITIZEN LIVE?

A kingdom cannot exist without government, and government cannot exist without standards. Elohim has revealed His will through His Word. His instructions reveal His righteousness, wisdom, justice, mercy, and holiness. When we truly know the King, obedience is no longer viewed as a burden. It becomes the joyful expression of covenant love.

SECTION 2 - THE LAW OF THE KINGDOM

Genesis 2:16-17

"The LORD God commanded the man..."

Before we can understand obedience, we must first understand government. Every kingdom includes a king, a people, and the king's law. Remove the law, and there is no government. Law does not create the Kingdom, but it preserves order within it. The Kingdom of Elohim is not governed by public opinion, changing culture, or human tradition. It is governed by the eternal Word of the King.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Where Elohim reigns, His Word governs.
- The King's instruction existed before sin entered the world.
- His authority is never separated from His instruction.
- The Kingdom becomes visible where the King's will is obeyed.

Kingdom Principle

Every kingdom requires law, and the Kingdom of Elohim is governed by the eternal Word of the King.

THE KING'S WORD ESTABLISHES GOVERNMENT

The government of Elohim did not begin at Mount Sinai. It began in the Garden. Before rebellion, judgment, and death, there was instruction. The King redeemed His people, entered covenant with them, and then instructed them. The pattern never changes: relationship precedes responsibility, redemption precedes instruction, and covenant produces obedience.

Do I receive the King's Word as instruction or restriction?

Where have I resisted the government of the King?

What area of my life needs to come under His Word?

SECTION 3 - THE WORD REVEALS THE KING

Exodus 34:6

"The LORD God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abundant in goodness and truth."

The Law of Elohim is far more than a list of commandments. It is revelation. The commandments reveal the character of the One who gave them. Because Elohim is holy, righteous, just, merciful, and faithful, everything He commands reflects His perfect nature. To know His Word is to know His ways. To understand His commandments is to understand His heart.

Key Kingdom Truths

- The King's Law is holy because the King is holy.
- His judgments are righteous because He is righteous.
- His commandments are faithful because He is faithful.
- Yeshua perfectly revealed the Father's character.

Kingdom Principle

The Law of Elohim reveals the heart, holiness, righteousness, justice, mercy, and faithfulness of the King.

SECTION 3 - THE WORD REVEALS THE KING

THE CHARACTER OF THE KING

Elohim never separates Himself from His Word. When He revealed Himself to Moses, He revealed His character: merciful, gracious, longsuffering, abundant in goodness and truth, and just. His instruction proceeds from who He is. In Yeshua, we behold the character of the King perfectly manifested.

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

What does the King's Word reveal about His character?

Do I study His commandments to know His heart?

Where has misunderstanding caused me to resist His instruction?

SECTION 4 - COVENANT LOVE PRODUCES OBEDIENCE

John 14:15

"If ye love me, keep my commandments."

Faithful citizens obey the King because they know Him, trust Him, and belong to Him. Obedience has never been the price of covenant. It is the fruit of covenant. Elohim first loved, redeemed, and called His people into covenant. Then He gave His Word to teach His redeemed people how to walk faithfully within it.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Obedience is not an attempt to earn favor.
- The commandments were given for the good of the King's people.
- The Spirit writes the King's Word upon transformed hearts.
- Love comes first, and obedience follows.

Kingdom Principle

Faithful obedience is the loving response of those who already belong to the King.

SECTION 4 - COVENANT LOVE PRODUCES OBEDIENCE

LOVE AND OBEDIENCE

The King does not say, "Obey Me so I may become your Elohim." He first declares covenant relationship. The commandments teach redeemed people how to live faithfully within covenant. Through the Renewed Covenant, Elohim does not remove His Law; He writes it upon the heart by His Spirit.

SECTION 4 - COVENANT LOVE PRODUCES OBEDIENCE

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

Is my obedience flowing from love or fear alone?

Where have I delayed obedience after conviction?

Do I delight in the King's commandments?

SECTION 5 - YESHUA AND THE LAW

Matthew 5:17

"I am not come to destroy, but to fulfil."

No voice carries greater authority than the voice of Yeshua Messiah. Throughout His ministry, Yeshua never presented Himself as opposing the Torah, the Prophets, or the writings given by the Father. He affirmed them, taught them, fulfilled them, and revealed their deepest meaning. He did not lower the righteous standard of the Kingdom. He called His disciples to live it from the heart.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Yeshua fulfilled the Law; He did not abolish it.
- He revealed the true intent of the Father's instruction.
- He exposed empty religious tradition and outward performance.
- He modeled perfect obedience to the Father.

Kingdom Principle

Yeshua revealed the righteous government of the Father and showed His citizens how to walk in faithful obedience.

THE KING DEFINES OBEDIENCE

Yeshua teaches that Kingdom righteousness begins in the heart and becomes visible through faithful living. Love for Elohim and love for neighbor are not opposed to the Law; they are the foundation upon which faithful obedience stands. In Yeshua, we see what perfect obedience looks like.

Have I allowed Yeshua to define faithful obedience?

Am I seeking outward compliance or inward transformation?

Where is the King calling me to follow His example more fully?

SECTION 6 - WALKING AS FAITHFUL CITIZENS

James 1:22

"Be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only."

Faithful citizens do not merely admire the King. They walk under His rule. Kingdom citizenship is demonstrated daily through thoughts, words, decisions, relationships, and obedience to His Word. The disciple does not ask, "What is the least I must do?" The faithful disciple asks, "How may I honor my King today?"

Key Kingdom Truths

- The blessed life is rooted in delighting in the King's Word.
- The wise builder hears the King's words and does them.
- Every area of life must come under the authority of the King.
- Faithful obedience is a continual posture of surrender.

Kingdom Principle

The Kingdom is made visible when the King's people hear His Word, obey His voice, and walk faithfully in His ways.

FROM HEARING TO LIVING

Both builders heard the words of the King. The difference was doing. Kingdom discipleship is not measured by knowledge alone, but by faithful obedience. The Bereans searched the Scriptures daily, and faithful disciples today must search the whole counsel of Scripture with humility, prayer, and dependence upon the Spirit.

KINGDOM ACTION STEPS

- Begin in Genesis and search the Scriptures prayerfully.
- Study the Torah to understand the Father's commandments, laws, statutes, and judgments.
- Give careful attention to the Ten Commandments, including the Sabbath.
- Ask the Father what each command reveals about His character.
- Measure every teaching against the written Word like the Bereans.
- Respond quickly to conviction with repentance and obedience.
- Delight in the King's Word and allow the Spirit to write it upon your heart.
- Walk as a faithful citizen whose life makes the Kingdom visible.

Looking Ahead to Week 5

In Week Five, we will explore Kingdom Holiness: Walking Worthy of the King. If the King is holy, and we belong to His Kingdom, then our lives are to reflect His holiness.

SECTION 6 - WALKING AS FAITHFUL CITIZENS

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

Am I a hearer only, or am I becoming a doer of the Word?

What command, conviction, or truth must I respond to this week?

How can my life make the Kingdom visible through obedience?

PRAYER OF TRANSFORMATION

Father, establish within me a true love for Your Word. Teach me to see Your commandments as the righteous instruction of my King and the revelation of Your holy character. Remove pride, rebellion, confusion, and every misunderstanding that causes me to resist Your ways. Write Your truth upon my heart by Your Spirit, and form in me the obedience that flows from covenant love. Help me to be not only a hearer of Your Word, but a faithful doer. May my worship, speech, decisions, relationships, conduct, and service reflect the rule, wisdom, and righteousness of Your Kingdom. In the name of Yeshua Messiah, Amen.
