



KINGDOM DISCIPLESHIP REFLECTION GUIDE

This guide was intentionally designed to move believers beyond hearing into transformation. Its purpose is to establish understanding, produce conviction, invite repentance, restore alignment, strengthen obedience, and cultivate transformed Kingdom living. This guide serves as a Kingdom discipleship companion that helps believers move from hearing to examining, repenting, aligning, obeying, and living. The goal is not merely information, but transformation through obedience under the rule of the King.

CLASS 7

The Source of Kingdom Power

SECTION 1 - POWER BELONGS TO ELOHIM

Psalm 62:11

“God hath spoken once; twice have I heard this; that power belongeth unto God.”

Key Kingdom Truths

- Kingdom power begins with the King, not the servant.
- Elohim is Creator, Sustainer, and sovereign Ruler over all things.
- His power is inseparable from His Word and always agrees with His holy character.
- The disciple is neither the source nor the owner of Kingdom power.

Kingdom Principle

Power belongs to Elohim. Kingdom citizens remain surrendered to the One who possesses it.

SECTION 1 - POWER BELONGS TO ELOHIM

Bible Foundations

- Genesis 1:1-3

Creation reveals Elohim as the source of all power; He speaks and creation responds.

- Exodus 15:6

Israel's deliverance reveals the glorious power of YAH over earthly kingdoms.

- Psalm 62:11

Power belongs to Elohim.

- Jeremiah 32:17

Nothing is too hard for the Creator who made heaven and earth by His great power.

- Ephesians 1:19-20

The resurrection of Yeshua reveals the exceeding greatness of Elohim's power.

SECTION 1 - POWER BELONGS TO ELOHIM

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

What does this section reveal about Elohim and the source or purpose of Kingdom power?

Where does this truth challenge my present thinking, confidence, or dependence?

What response of surrender, obedience, or faithfulness is the King calling me to make?

SECTION 2 - HUMAN STRENGTH IS INSUFFICIENT

Zechariah 4:6

“Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the LORD of hosts.”

Key Kingdom Truths

- Human gifts and abilities have value, but they were never intended to replace dependence upon Elohim.
- Self-reliance quietly shifts confidence from the King to ourselves.
- Yeshua taught that lasting Kingdom fruit requires abiding in Him.
- Weakness can become the place where Elohim’s sufficiency is most clearly revealed.

Kingdom Principle

The Kingdom does not advance through self-sufficiency. It advances through surrender.

SECTION 2 - HUMAN STRENGTH IS INSUFFICIENT

Bible Foundations

- Deuteronomy 8:17-18

Israel is warned not to attribute Elohim-given ability and provision to its own strength.

- Psalm 20:7-8

Trust belongs in the name of YAH rather than human resources.

- Psalm 127:1

Human labor is vain when YAH is not the builder.

- John 15:5

Kingdom fruit requires abiding in Yeshua.

- 2 Corinthians 12:9

Elohim's strength is made perfect in weakness.

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What response of surrender, obedience, or faithfulness is the King calling me to make?

SECTION 3 - THE KING EQUIPS THOSE HE CALLS

1 Thessalonians 5:24

"Faithful is he that calleth you, who also will do it."

Key Kingdom Truths

- The King calls ordinary people and equips them according to His purposes.
- His presence is greater than the limitations of His servants.
- The question is not whether we are enough, but whether we trust the King who called us.
- His empowerment exists so that He receives the glory.

Kingdom Principle

If He calls, He equips. If He sends, He sustains.

SECTION 3 - THE KING EQUIPS THOSE HE CALLS

Bible Foundations

- Exodus 31:2-5
Bezaleel is called and filled with the Spirit of Elohim for the work entrusted to him.
- Exodus 4:11-12
Elohim answers Moses' inadequacy with His presence and instruction.
- Psalm 18:32-34
The King gives strength and teaches His servant.
- Isaiah 61:1
The Spirit, anointing, and assignment reveal the pattern of divine empowerment.
- 1 Peter 4:11
Ministry is carried out through the ability Elohim gives so that He is glorified.

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SECTION 4 - THE HOLY SPIRIT EMPOWERS THE KING'S PEOPLE

Acts 1:8

"But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me..."

Key Kingdom Truths

- The Spirit of Elohim is essential to faithful Kingdom work.
- The Spirit teaches, leads, guides, convicts, strengthens, and empowers.
- The Spirit empowers obedience and points people to Yeshua.
- Kingdom power cannot be manufactured by human effort.

Kingdom Principle

Where the King assigns responsibility, He provides His presence.

SECTION 4 - THE HOLY SPIRIT EMPOWERS THE KING'S PEOPLE

Bible Foundations

- Genesis 1:1-2
The Spirit of Elohim is present and active at creation.
- Numbers 11:25
The Spirit rests upon the elders so they can carry entrusted responsibility.
- Psalm 51:11-12
David recognizes the necessity of Elohim's presence and Spirit.
- Joel 2:28-29
The prophets anticipate the outpouring of the Spirit.
- John 16:13-14
The Spirit guides into truth and glorifies Yeshua.
- Acts 1:8
The Spirit empowers believers to bear witness to Yeshua.

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SECTION 5 - KINGDOM POWER EXISTS FOR THE GLORY OF THE KING

Psalm 115:1

“Not unto us, O LORD, not unto us, but unto thy name give glory...”

Key Kingdom Truths

- Kingdom power is never given to magnify the servant.
- The mighty acts of Elohim reveal His name, goodness, authority, mercy, and faithfulness.
- Yeshua demonstrated that power is exercised in humility and directed toward the glory of Elohim.
- Everything in the Kingdom ultimately points back to the King.

Kingdom Principle

Power belongs to Elohim, and all glory belongs to the King.

SECTION 5 - KINGDOM POWER EXISTS FOR THE GLORY OF THE KING

Bible Foundations

- Exodus 9:16
Elohim displays His power so His name may be declared throughout the earth.
- Psalm 115:1
Glory belongs to the name of YAH, not to His servants.
- Habakkuk 2:14
The earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of YAH.
- John 11:4
Yeshua identifies the glory of Elohim as the purpose revealed through the miracle.
- 1 Corinthians 10:31
Whatever Kingdom citizens do should be done to the glory of Elohim.
- Revelation 4:11
The King alone is worthy to receive glory, honor, and power.

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What response of surrender, obedience, or faithfulness is the King calling me to make?

KINGDOM ACTION STEPS

- Examine where your confidence rests. Identify any area where gifts, experience, resources, or personal strength have begun to replace dependence upon Elohim.
- Practice daily surrender. Begin each assignment by acknowledging that power belongs to the King and asking for His wisdom, presence, and strength.
- Remain faithful in what the King has entrusted to you. Do not wait until you feel sufficient before obeying His call.
- Yield to the Holy Spirit. Make room for His teaching, conviction, guidance, and empowering work.
- Redirect the glory. When Elohim works through your life, intentionally point attention back to the King.

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

What truth from Week Seven most deeply strengthened or corrected my understanding of Kingdom power?

Where must I move from self-reliance into greater dependence upon Elohim?

How will I ensure that the glory returns to the King when He works through my life?

PRAYER OF TRANSFORMATION

Father, establish within us the truth that all power belongs to You. Deliver us from pride, ambition, and self-reliance. Teach us to remain surrendered, faithful, and dependent upon You. Empower us by Your Spirit to accomplish only what You have entrusted to us, and guard our hearts so that every gift, opportunity, answered prayer, and work of power points back to Your glory. May we seek the King more than the power of the Kingdom, and may our lives faithfully bear witness to Yeshua Messiah. Amen.
