KINGDOM DISCIPLESHIP REFLECTION GUIDE

This guide was intentionally designed to move believers beyond hearing into transformation. Its purpose is to establish understanding, produce conviction, invite repentance, restore alignment, strengthen obedience, and cultivate transformed Kingdom living. This guide serves as a Kingdom discipleship companion that helps believers move from: hearing → examining → repenting → aligning → obeying → living. The goal is not merely information, but transformation through obedience under the rule of the King.

CLASS 10

The Kingdom Message & Apostolic Mission Proclaiming the King, Making Disciples & Spirit-Empowered Witness

SECTION 1 - INTRODUCTION

Matthew 24:14

"And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come."

Week Ten brings Phase Two to the purpose for which power is given, authority is entrusted, and character is formed: the King has a mission. The King prepares His servants because He intends to send them, and He determines both the message and the assignment.

Yeshua proclaimed the Gospel of the Kingdom. He announced Elohim's reign, called people to repentance and faith, taught the ways of the Kingdom, demonstrated its reality, and made disciples. Before returning to the Father, He commanded His followers to continue this work among the nations.

This teaching reminds us that apostolic mission is not primarily about a title. It is the responsibility of being sent by the King, with the King's message, for the King's purpose. We are messengers, not authors, and we have no authority to reshape the Gospel around human desires.

The mission includes proclaiming the Gospel, calling people to respond, making disciples, baptizing, teaching obedience, and preparing faithful disciples to teach others. Yet the work cannot be accomplished through natural strength. The King's mission requires the Holy Spirit.

As we move through Week Ten, may we receive the King's message, embrace His mission, depend upon His Spirit, and live ready to bear faithful witness to Yeshua wherever Elohim sends us.

Kingdom Principle

We are a sent people, carrying the message of the King, for the mission of the King, in the power of the Holy Spirit.

SECTION 2 - THE GOSPEL OF THE KINGDOM

Luke 4:43

The Gospel of the Kingdom is the good news that Elohim reigns, His promised Messiah Yeshua has come, and salvation is offered through Him. The messenger does not create or reshape this message; the King determines it.

The Gospel centers upon the Eternal King, His saving work through Yeshua Messiah, and His call for humanity to respond to His reign.

Key Kingdom Truths

- The message originates with Elohim, not the messenger.
- The Gospel announces the reign of the Eternal King.
- The Kingdom and Yeshua Messiah cannot be separated.
- The King's truth must be carried without compromise.

Kingdom Principle

We are messengers, not authors; faithful Kingdom witness carries the message the King has entrusted.

THE KING DETERMINES THE MESSAGE

The Gospel did not begin with the messenger. The Torah pointed toward the coming Prophet, the Psalms announced Elohim's reign, the Prophets proclaimed good tidings, and Yeshua came preaching the Gospel of the Kingdom.

- The Eternal King reigns.
- Yeshua Messiah has come.
- Salvation is offered through Him.
- Humanity is called to repent, believe, and follow the King.

The audience and method may change, but the message remains the King's.

SECTION 2 - THE GOSPEL OF THE KINGDOM

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

Am I carrying the Gospel the King gave, or reshaping it to suit my preferences?

Does my witness clearly center on Elohim's reign and Yeshua Messiah?

Where have I remained silent about the Kingdom message?

SECTION 3 - REPENTANCE AND FAITH

Mark 1:14-15

The Gospel of the Kingdom requires a response. Repentance turns the heart away from sin and self-rule toward Elohim, while faith places our trust in Yeshua Messiah and begins a life of allegiance beneath the King.

Repentance turns us from sin and self-rule. Faith places our trust in Yeshua Messiah. Obedience becomes the fruit of a changed life.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Repentance is a genuine turning toward Elohim.
- Faith and repentance belong together.
- True sorrow desires a clean heart and restored fellowship.
- Obedience reveals a changed direction and allegiance.

Kingdom Principle

The Kingdom message calls us to leave rebellion, trust Yeshua Messiah, and begin walking as people who belong to the King.

BIBLICAL REPENTANCE IS A TURNING

Biblical repentance is more than regret or an emotional response. It is a turning of the heart and life toward Elohim. Yeshua joined this call to the command to believe the Gospel.

- Turn from sin and self-rule.
- Return to Elohim with the whole heart.
- Place faith in Yeshua Messiah.
- Walk in obedience as one who belongs to the King.

Repentance changes direction; faith trusts the King; obedience reveals the fruit.

SECTION 3 - REPENTANCE AND FAITH

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

What evidence shows that my repentance is changing the direction of my life?

Where am I still defending self-rule instead of surrendering to the King?

What act of obedience should now bear fruit from my faith in Yeshua?

SECTION 4 - THE GREAT COMMISSION

Matthew 28:18-20

Yeshua did not command His followers merely to gather converts. He commissioned them to make disciples among the nations - baptizing them, teaching them to obey, and preparing faithful disciples to pass the King's truth forward.

We proclaim the Gospel so people may come to the King; then we teach those who come how to walk faithfully with the King.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Disciple-making includes going, baptizing, and teaching.
- Biblical teaching is intended to produce biblical living.
- Yeshua is the Master; human teachers are not the destination.
- Faithful disciples are prepared to disciple others.

Kingdom Principle

The Kingdom advances as faithful disciples make faithful disciples who carry the King's truth into another generation.

SECTION 4 - THE GREAT COMMISSION

Bible Foundations

These foundational Scriptures support and strengthen the Kingdom principles taught within this section.

MAKE DISCIPLES, NOT MERELY CONVERTS

Kingdom discipleship begins with truth held in the heart and lived before it is taught. The goal is not merely biblical information, but people who know Elohim, follow Yeshua, and learn to walk in the King's ways.

- Go where the King sends.
- Baptize those who respond to the Gospel.
- Teach disciples to observe Yeshua's commands.
- Entrust the truth to faithful people who can teach others.

Discipleship requires teaching, example, correction, encouragement, patience, and time.

SECTION 4 - THE GREAT COMMISSION

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

Am I only sharing information, or helping someone learn to follow Yeshua?

What truth must govern my own life before I can faithfully teach it?

Who is Elohim calling me to strengthen and prepare to disciple others?

SECTION 5 - THE MISSION REQUIRES THE HOLY SPIRIT

Acts 1:8

The disciples knew the message and had received the commission, yet Yeshua told them to wait for power from on high. A spiritual mission cannot be fulfilled through human ability; faithful witness requires the Holy Spirit.

**The message belongs to the King. The mission belongs to the King.
The power necessary to fulfill it also comes from the King.**

Key Kingdom Truths

- The Holy Spirit is the Father's promised gift.
- Spirit-empowerment produces faithful witness and boldness.
- The Spirit leads servants according to the King's will.
- Receiving the Spirit begins a life of continued dependence.

Kingdom Principle

The King's mission requires the Spirit of the King; preparation and strategy can never replace His presence, leading, and power.

SECTION 5 - THE MISSION REQUIRES THE HOLY SPIRIT

SPIRIT-EMPOWERED WITNESS

Elohim supplies what His servants need for the responsibility He gives. The Holy Spirit is received as the Father's gift, and His servants must continue depending upon His leading and power.

- The Holy Spirit comes.
- Power from on high is received.
- Witness to Yeshua follows.
- The mission extends outward to the nations.

Effective Kingdom witness is learning to speak, wait, and move according to the Spirit's leading.

SECTION 5 - THE MISSION REQUIRES THE HOLY SPIRIT

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

Where am I attempting the King's mission through my own strength?

Am I waiting for and following the Holy Spirit's direction before I act?

What fear must I surrender so the Holy Spirit can give me boldness?

SECTION 6 - THE APOSTOLIC MISSION AMONG THE NATIONS

John 20:21

Apostolic mission is fundamentally about being sent. Kingdom citizens carry the King's message, represent His government, and bear witness to Yeshua wherever the King directs - across the street or across the nations.

We are not merely a people who have been called out. We are a people who have been sent to make the King known among the nations.

Key Kingdom Truths

- The mission to the nations runs throughout Scripture.
- Being sent means representing the One who sends us.
- The Gospel is not ours to restrict or rewrite.
- Every assignment is an opportunity to bear witness to Yeshua.

Kingdom Principle

The assignment may differ, but every Kingdom citizen is responsible to faithfully represent the King wherever He sends.

APOSTOLIC MEANS SENT

From Abraham's call to Yeshua's commission, Scripture reveals Elohim's purpose moving outward so that His way and salvation may be known among the nations.

- Carry the King's message rather than a personal message.
- Represent the King through both words and conduct.
- Go wherever the King directs and makes opportunity.
- Depend upon the Holy Spirit until Yeshua returns.

We do not make ourselves famous or build our own kingdom; we make the King known.

KINGDOM ACTION STEPS

- Begin each day by praying, "Here I am, King. Send me."
- Rehearse the Gospel of the Kingdom until you can explain it clearly.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to identify one person who needs faithful witness.
- Share the Gospel without removing repentance, Yeshua, or the King's reign.
- Follow up with someone who needs instruction, encouragement, or strengthening.
- Submit your plans and methods to the Holy Spirit's direction.
- Represent Yeshua with humility in your family, community, workplace, and ministry.

PRAYER OF TRANSFORMATION

Father, establish Your Kingdom within me and make me faithful to Your mission.

Keep me from reshaping Your Gospel around human desires.

Give me courage to proclaim Yeshua and call people to repentance and faith.

Teach me to make disciples who know Your Word and walk in obedience.

Deliver me from dependence upon my own strength, ability, or methods.

Fill me with Your Holy Spirit and lead me wherever You desire to send me.

Let my words, conduct, and service faithfully represent the King.

Use my life to make Your Kingdom known among families, peoples, and nations.

May my answer remain, "Here I am, King. Send me."

In the mighty name of Yeshua Messiah, Amen.

May you faithfully carry the message of the King, depend upon the Holy Spirit,
and represent Yeshua wherever Elohim sends you.
