The goal is not merely information, but transformation through obedience under the rule of the King.

CLASS 7

The Source of Kingdom Power

Dependence, Empowerment & The Glory of the King

SECTION 1 - INTRODUCTION

Psalm 62:11

“God hath spoken once; twice have I heard this; that power belongeth unto God.”

Week 7 begins Phase Two of the Kingdom Discipleship Framework: Kingdom Power, Authority, and Mission. After six weeks of formation, the teaching turns to a foundational question: Where does Kingdom power come from?

The testimony of Scripture is clear. Kingdom power does not originate in human strength, natural ability, education, influence, personality, position, or ministry. Power belongs to Elohim because He alone is Creator, Sustainer, and sovereign Ruler over all things.

The Torah, Psalms, Prophets, Yeshua, and the apostles all reveal the same pattern. The Kingdom advances by the power of the King. His Word accomplishes His will, impossible circumstances remain beneath His sovereignty, and even death could not defeat His purpose.

Week 7 also confronts the danger of self-reliance. Human gifts have value, but they were never intended to replace dependence upon Elohim. The Kingdom advances through surrender, and the King equips ordinary servants who recognize their need for Him.

Finally, this teaching reveals that the Holy Spirit empowers the people of Elohim and that Kingdom power is always given for the King's glory. The servant is never the source, owner, or center. Power exists to reveal the King and make His name known.

Kingdom Principle

Kingdom power belongs to Elohim, flows through His Spirit, and is entrusted to surrendered servants for the glory of the King.

SECTION 2 - POWER BELONGS TO ELOHIM

Psalm 62:11

Kingdom power begins with the King. Elohim alone is Creator, Sustainer, and sovereign Ruler over all things. No servant, gift, government, resource, or created being possesses power independently of Him.

Kingdom power does not begin with a servant, a gift, a title, a ministry, or human ability. Power belongs to Elohim, and every true work of the Kingdom flows from Him.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Power belongs to Elohim by nature.
- His Word carries the ability to accomplish His will.
- His power is eternal, unlimited, wise, and holy.
- We are vessels of His power, never its source or owner.

Kingdom Principle

Our responsibility is not to manufacture power, but to remain surrendered to the One who possesses it.

SECTION 2 - POWER BELONGS TO ELOHIM

THE SOURCE OF KINGDOM POWER

Scripture reveals Elohim as the sovereign Source of all true power. He is:

- Creator
- Sustainer
- Sovereign Ruler
- Unlimited by human impossibility
- Perfectly wise and holy in every work

Power belongs to the King, and His power always agrees with His character and accomplishes His will.

SECTION 2 - POWER BELONGS TO ELOHIM

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

Where have I placed confidence in my own ability, resources, or influence rather than in Elohim?

Do I desire Kingdom power to reveal the King, or to gain recognition for myself?

How should remembering that I am not the source, owner, or center change the way I respond when Elohim works through me?

SECTION 3 - HUMAN STRENGTH IS INSUFFICIENT

Zechariah 4:6

Human gifts, intellect, creativity, and skill have value, but they were never intended to replace dependence upon Elohim. Human effort may produce activity, yet only the King can produce eternal Kingdom fruit.

The Kingdom does not advance through self-sufficiency. It advances through surrender. What is built upon human strength will fail, but what is built upon the faithfulness of Elohim will endure.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Success can tempt the heart to forget its Source.
- Resources are useful, but they make poor saviors.
- Kingdom fruit requires continual abiding in Yeshua.
- Human weakness creates room for His sufficiency to be seen.

Kingdom Principle

The less we depend upon ourselves, the more room we make for the power of the King to be revealed through our lives.

SECTION 3 - HUMAN STRENGTH IS INSUFFICIENT

DEPENDENCE, NOT SELF-SUFFICIENCY

Kingdom citizens remain effective by continually choosing to:

- Remember the Source
- Trust the King above every resource
- Abide in Yeshua
- Surrender personal limitations
- Refuse pride and self-reliance

The King is not asking His servants to become self-sufficient. He is calling them to remain surrendered.

SECTION 3 - HUMAN STRENGTH IS INSUFFICIENT

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

What success, gift, resource, or experience has quietly become a substitute for dependence upon Elohim?

Where am I laboring in my own strength instead of abiding in Yeshua and trusting the King?

What weakness or limitation do I need to surrender so that Elohim's sufficiency can be revealed?

SECTION 4 - THE KING EQUIPS THOSE HE CALLS

1 Thessalonians 5:24

The King never calls His people to an assignment without providing what is necessary to fulfill it. He chooses ordinary people, remains present with them, and equips them according to the purpose He has assigned.

The Kingdom pattern is consistent: the King calls, the King equips, and the servant remains dependent. His presence has always been the difference between human inadequacy and faithful obedience.

Key Kingdom Truths

- Divine calling is not dependent upon human sufficiency.
- The King supplies what His assignments require.
- He equips each servant according to the assignment.
- Faithfulness, not self-sufficiency, is the requirement.

Kingdom Principle

If the King calls, He equips; if He sends, He sustains; and if He begins the work, He is faithful to complete it.

THE PATTERN OF DIVINE EMPOWERMENT

Throughout Scripture, the King's order remains consistent:

- The King calls
- The King equips
- The King sends
- The King sustains
- The servant glorifies the King

The question is not, 'Am I enough?' but, 'Is the King enough?' Scripture answers with a resounding yes.

SECTION 4 - THE KING EQUIPS THOSE HE CALLS

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

Which Kingdom assignment have I delayed because I have focused more on my limitations than on the King's sufficiency?

Do I trust that the King will supply what His assignment requires, or am I waiting to feel completely capable?

What step of faithful obedience can I take now while remaining dependent upon Elohim?

SECTION 5 - THE HOLY SPIRIT EMPOWERS

Acts 1:8

Kingdom power flows from the presence and work of the Holy Spirit. He is not an impersonal force, but the Spirit of Elohim who teaches, leads, convicts, strengthens, and empowers His people to fulfill the King's purposes.

Without the Holy Spirit, Kingdom work becomes human effort. With Him, ordinary people become faithful witnesses of the King. Where the King assigns responsibility, He provides His presence.

Key Kingdom Truths

- The Spirit was active in creation and throughout Scripture.
- He enables people to carry divinely assigned responsibility.
- He empowers obedience, holiness, and lasting fruit.
- His power equips believers to bear witness to Yeshua.

Kingdom Principle

The Holy Spirit is not given to make much of the servant; He empowers the servant to make much of the King.

THE WORK OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Holy Spirit faithfully works within the people of Elohim to:

- Teach
- Lead
- Convict
- Strengthen
- Empower faithful witness

The Spirit does not glorify Himself or the servant. He glorifies Yeshua and advances the purposes of the King.

SECTION 5 - THE HOLY SPIRIT EMPOWERS

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

Am I attempting Kingdom work through knowledge, activity, or effort without depending upon the Holy Spirit?

In what area do I most need the Spirit’s teaching, guidance, conviction, or strength?

Does the fruit of my life point people toward Yeshua, or does it draw attention toward me?

SECTION 6 - POWER IS GIVEN TO GLORIFY THE KING

Psalm 115:1

Kingdom power is given to glorify the King. Whenever people lose sight of this purpose, power becomes vulnerable to misuse through influence, control, recognition, pride, or personal advancement.

Kingdom power does not exalt the servant; it reveals the King. Every sign, deliverance, transformation, gift, and victory should point beyond itself to the One from whom all power flows.

Key Kingdom Truths

- The King displays His power so His name will be known.
- All glory, victory, and majesty belong to Elohim.
- Everything Kingdom citizens do should honor the King.
- Faithful servants continually redirect attention to Him.

Kingdom Principle

The moment power becomes about the servant, it departs from its purpose; Kingdom power exists to reveal and glorify the King.

SECTION 6 - POWER IS GIVEN TO GLORIFY THE KING

POWER EXISTS FOR HIS GLORY

The posture of every faithful Kingdom citizen is, 'Not unto us, but unto Your name.' To Elohim belong:

- The Kingdom
- The power
- The glory
- The victory
- The majesty

We are not the source. We are servants of the King, and every entrusted work must direct glory back to Him.

KINGDOM ACTION STEPS

- Begin each day by declaring that all true power belongs to Elohim.
- Identify where confidence has shifted from the King to your gifts, resources, or experience.
- Abide in Yeshua through prayer, the Word, surrender, and immediate obedience.
- Respond faithfully to the assignment the King has given instead of waiting to feel sufficient.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to teach, guide, convict, strengthen, and empower you.
- Redirect praise and attention to Elohim whenever He accomplishes something through you.
- Journal where the King is revealing His sufficiency through your weakness or limitation.

PRAYER OF TRANSFORMATION

Father, all power belongs to You.

Forgive me for trusting my strength, gifts, experience, or resources more than You.

Deliver me from pride, self-reliance, ambition, and the desire for recognition.

Teach me to abide in Yeshua and remain surrendered to Your will.
Give me courage to obey when I feel weak, inadequate, or unprepared.

Fill me with Your Holy Spirit and empower me to faithfully carry Your assignment.

Let every work, gift, answer, and victory point people back to the King.
May Your power be revealed, Your purposes advanced, and Your name glorified.

In the mighty name of Yeshua Messiah, Amen.

May you remain humble, dependent upon the Holy Spirit, and faithful to direct all glory to the King.
