The goal is not merely information, but transformation through obedience under the rule of the King.

CLASS 9

The Character Required to Carry Power

**Humility, Integrity, Pure Motives,
Self-Control & Faithfulness**

SECTION 1 - THE KING LOOKS AT THE HEART

1 Samuel 16:7

Kingdom character begins within because Elohim sees the thoughts, desires, intentions, and loyalties that people cannot see. Outward gifting, influence, and reputation can never substitute for a heart that truly belongs to the King.

"...for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the LORD looketh on the heart."

Key Kingdom Truths

- Kingdom character begins where Elohim examines every intention.
- Gifting and reputation never substitute for a heart that belongs to the King.
- Faithful servants welcome Elohim's searching light.
- The heart eventually shapes words, choices, and stewardship.

Kingdom Principle

Before the King entrusts greater responsibility, the servant must be willing to let Him search and govern the heart.

SECTION 1 - THE KING LOOKS AT THE HEART

Bible Foundations

- Genesis 6:5
- 1 Samuel 16:7
- Luke 6:45
- Psalm 139:23-24
- Jeremiah 17:9-10
- 1 Corinthians 4:5

These foundational Scriptures support and strengthen the Kingdom principles taught within this section.

THE KING SEARCHES THE INWARD LIFE

Elohim sees that outward conduct flows from the inward life. He searches the heart, exposes what is hidden, and invites His servants to receive correction rather than hide from His examination.

- Invite Elohim to search the heart and reveal what is wrong.
- Remember that hidden intentions will be brought to light.
- Recognize that what is stored within eventually comes forth.
- Let the King govern the inward life before seeking greater trust.

The faithful servant welcomes the searching light of Elohim and obeys what He reveals.

SECTION 1 - THE KING LOOKS AT THE HEART

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

What might Elohim see in my heart that gifting, activity, or reputation could cause others - or me - to overlook?

Where do my recent words, reactions, or choices reveal an inward attitude that needs the King's correction?

What would it look like this week to sincerely pray, "Search me," and then obey what Elohim reveals?

SECTION 2 - HUMILITY KEEPS THE VESSEL BENEATH THE KING

Matthew 23:12

Humility remembers that every gift, opportunity, open door, and measure of influence was received from Elohim. Pride turns stewardship into personal significance, while Kingdom greatness is expressed through faithful service.

**"He that shall humble himself shall be exalted."
The servant remains bowed before the throne.**

Key Kingdom Truths

- Every gift, opportunity, and measure of influence comes from Elohim.
- Pride turns stewardship into self-importance.
- Kingdom greatness is expressed through service, not self-exaltation.
- A safe servant remains bowed before the King and returns His glory.

Kingdom Principle

The more the King entrusts, the more carefully the servant must remember who the Source is.

SECTION 2 - HUMILITY KEEPS THE VESSEL BENEATH THE KING

Bible Foundations

- Deuteronomy 8:17-18
- Daniel 4:30-32
- 1 Corinthians 4:7
- Psalm 131:1-2
- Matthew 23:11-12

These foundational Scriptures support and strengthen the Kingdom principles taught within this section.

HUMILITY REMEMBERS THE SOURCE

Scripture repeatedly warns servants not to credit their own power for what Elohim has graciously provided. Kingdom greatness is expressed through service, and boasting ends when we remember that everything we possess was received.

- Reject the temptation to claim the King's work as personal greatness.
- Cultivate a quiet heart that does not reach for prominence.
- Choose service instead of self-exaltation.
- Return praise, opportunity, and influence to the glory of Elohim.

The safest posture for a servant carrying Kingdom power is bowed before the throne.

SECTION 2 - HUMILITY KEEPS THE VESSEL BENEATH THE KING

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

When Elohim allows success, recognition, or increase, what thoughts or desires most tempt me to shift attention from the Source to myself?

Am I content to serve faithfully when my assignment is unseen, unimpressive, or does not increase my personal significance?

How can I intentionally redirect praise, opportunity, and influence back toward the glory of the King?

SECTION 3 - INTEGRITY ALIGNS THE PRIVATE AND PUBLIC LIFE

Genesis 39:9

Integrity is wholeness - being faithful before Elohim whether many people, few people, or no people are watching. Private compromise cannot be compensated for by public gifting, ministry, influence, or responsibility.

**"How then can I do this great wickedness, and sin against God?"
Invisible decisions reveal readiness for visible responsibility.**

Key Kingdom Truths

- Integrity is wholeness, whether many people or no one is watching.
- Private compromise cannot be offset by public gifting or ministry.
- Faithfulness in hidden matters reveals readiness for greater trust.
- Kingdom integrity aligns the message, messenger, and accountability.

Kingdom Principle

The character required for visible responsibility is often revealed through invisible decisions.

SECTION 3 - INTEGRITY ALIGNS THE PRIVATE AND PUBLIC LIFE

Bible Foundations

- Genesis 39:7-9
- Psalm 101:2-3
- Malachi 2:6
- Luke 16:10-12
- 2 Corinthians 8:21

These foundational Scriptures support and strengthen the Kingdom principles taught within this section.

INTEGRITY IS PROVEN IN THE HIDDEN LIFE

Joseph refused hidden compromise because he understood that sin would ultimately be against Elohim. Scripture joins private faithfulness, truth, and honorable conduct with readiness for greater trust.

- Walk with a faithful heart within your own house.
- Reject compromise even when no human audience is present.
- Be faithful in little and in what belongs to another.
- Welcome conduct and accountability that can withstand examination.

Kingdom integrity brings the message and the messenger into honest alignment.

SECTION 3 - INTEGRITY ALIGNS THE PRIVATE AND PUBLIC LIFE

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

Who am I when there is no audience to impress, and does that private life agree with the witness I present publicly?

What "small" responsibility, habit, or hidden decision is currently revealing the true condition of my integrity?

Where do I need to choose truth, accountability, or repentance so that my life and message come back into alignment?

SECTION 4 - PURITY OF MOTIVE KEEPS THE PURPOSE CENTERED ON THE KING

Psalm 51:6

The King examines not only what we do but why we do it. Outwardly righteous service can still be driven by status, visibility, personal significance, or competition instead of Elohim's will and glory.

**"Behold, thou desirest truth in the inward parts."
Pure service remains centered on the glory of the King.**

Key Kingdom Truths

- The King examines both what we do and why we do it.
- Service must center on Elohim's will, not status or visibility.
- Spiritual usefulness must never become personal advancement.
- Pure motives rejoice when Elohim is glorified through another.

Kingdom Principle

The safest motive for carrying Kingdom responsibility is not the desire to become great, but the desire for the King to be glorified.

SECTION 4 - PURITY OF MOTIVE KEEPS THE PURPOSE CENTERED ON THE KING

Bible Foundations

- Numbers 16:8-10
- Psalm 51:6
- Jeremiah 12:3
- Matthew 6:1-4
- Acts 8:18-20

These foundational Scriptures support and strengthen the Kingdom principles taught within this section.

THE KING EXAMINES WHY WE SERVE

Korah sought a position Elohim had not assigned, while Yeshua warned that righteous acts can be corrupted when performed to be seen. Elohim desires truth in the inward parts and tests the direction of the heart.

- Receive sacred service without grasping for unassigned position.
- Serve Elohim even when human recognition is absent.
- Refuse to use spiritual gifts as a means of personal advancement.
- Rejoice whenever the King is glorified, even through another person.

Pure motives remain satisfied when Elohim is glorified and our own name remains unknown.

SECTION 4 - PURITY OF MOTIVE KEEPS THE PURPOSE CENTERED ON THE KING

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

If no one applauded, mentioned my name, or knew what I had done, would I still be willing to obey and serve with the same devotion?

Where might comparison, recognition, status, or the need to feel important be influencing why I want a particular Kingdom assignment?

Can I genuinely rejoice when Elohim advances His purpose through someone else, and what does my response reveal about my motive?

SECTION 5 - SELF-CONTROL AND FAITHFULNESS KEEP THE SERVANT GOVERNED

Galatians 5:22-23

Self-control means desires, emotions, appetites, words, and actions remain submitted to the rule of Elohim. Faithfulness is continued obedience over time, including difficult, unnoticed, and costly seasons of assignment.

**"Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law."
The empowered servant must remain governed by the King.**

Key Kingdom Truths

- Self-control submits desires, words, and actions to Elohim.
- Spiritual power never removes the need for inward government.
- Faithfulness continues through costly, difficult, and unseen seasons.
- The Spirit produces both outward power and inward fruit.

Kingdom Principle

The servant who carries Kingdom power must also remain governed by the King and faithful over time.

SECTION 5 - SELF-CONTROL AND FAITHFULNESS KEEP THE SERVANT GOVERNED

Bible Foundations

- Genesis 4:6-7
- Judges 16:17-21
- Galatians 5:22-23
- Psalm 141:3-4
- Matthew 24:45-47

These foundational Scriptures support and strengthen the Kingdom principles taught within this section.

POWER REQUIRES INWARD GOVERNMENT

Cain was warned to rule over sinful desire before it produced devastating action. Samson's life shows that extraordinary empowerment does not protect a servant who repeatedly yields to wrong desires.

- Ask YAH to guard both the mouth and the desires of the heart.
- Submit appetites, emotions, words, and actions to Elohim.
- Remain faithful to the work the Master assigned.
- Let the Holy Spirit produce inward fruit alongside outward service.

Gifting is not the same as maturity; trustworthy servants remain governed and faithful.

SECTION 5 - SELF-CONTROL AND FAITHFULNESS KEEP THE SERVANT GOVERNED

Reflection, Conviction & Repentance

What desire, emotion, appetite, word pattern, or habit most needs to come more fully beneath the government of Elohim?

Have I allowed past gifting, spiritual experiences, or visible usefulness to make me less attentive to an area of character that still needs correction?

What assignment has the King entrusted to me that now requires steady faithfulness rather than excitement, recognition, or immediate results?

KINGDOM ACTION STEPS

- Invite Elohim to search your heart daily. Do not measure character only by visible behavior; respond to what He reveals within.
- Practice deliberate humility. When praise, opportunity, or increase comes, remember the Source and return the glory to the King.
- Strengthen integrity in one hidden area. Choose the same obedience in private that you would want to display publicly.
- Examine your motives before serving, speaking, leading, or pursuing opportunity. Ask whether the King's glory would still satisfy you without recognition.
- Bring one undisciplined area beneath Elohim's rule and remain faithful to your present assignment even when the work is difficult or unseen.

LOOKING AHEAD TO WEEK 10

The Kingdom Message & Apostolic Mission - After examining the character required to carry Kingdom power and authority, Week Ten turns to the purpose for which servants are empowered and sent: proclaiming the message of the Kingdom and faithfully carrying out the mission entrusted by the King.

FINAL HEART CHECK

- Which area of Kingdom character - heart, humility, integrity, motive, self-control, or faithfulness - has Elohim most strongly brought under examination this week?
- What hidden weakness or inward pattern could become more damaging if my influence or responsibility increased without first being addressed?
- What concrete act of surrender will help me become more trustworthy with whatever the King chooses to entrust?

PRAYER OF TRANSFORMATION

Abba Father, YAH Elohim, search us and know our hearts. Reveal every trace of pride, hidden compromise, selfish ambition, undisciplined desire, and craving for recognition that would hinder us from faithfully carrying what belongs to You. Form within us humility that remembers the Source, integrity that remains true when no one is watching, motives that desire Your glory above our own, self-control that keeps our inner life beneath Your government, and faithfulness that continues over time. May we desire character more than recognition, Your approval more than the praise of men, and obedience more than influence. Make us trustworthy servants who remain surrendered to the King in every season and with every assignment. In the mighty name of Yeshua Messiah, we pray. Amen.

LET THIS BE OUR COMMITMENT

May our hearts remain surrendered, our motives pure, and our lives marked by integrity. May we choose humility over self-exaltation, faithfulness over recognition, self-control over unchecked desire, and the approval of Elohim over the praise of men. If the King increases our responsibility, may we remain bowed before His throne and return every measure of glory to Him. For Kingdom power requires Kingdom character, and the servant who carries what belongs to the King must remain surrendered to the King.
